Alcock, John			"This last lately was inoculated for the Small Pox, and recover'd." No listings in the MD State Archives online.
Anderson, Richard			MD State Archive listings inconclusive due to multiple instances of name.
	Andrews, Jos:		Noted on Gilbert passenger list as a convict in London. No records returned in search of Old Bailey proceedings. No information in the Andrews Family Forum. MD State Archive listings inconclusive due to multiple instances of name.
Angel, John			No listings in the MD State Archives online.
Beton, John	Beaton, John		Noted on Gilbert passenger list as a convict in London. Of St. Martin, Outwich. John Be[a]ton stole lengths of canvas belonging to Wm Knight and Nat Platt and fenced them through Richard Farthing. Both found guilty at trial 6 th of December 1721 and <i>sentenced to transportation in the same session as Edward Corder</i> . No further information in the Beaton Family Forum. No listings in the MD State Archives online. (See also Farthing, Richard)
	Bickerton, John		Gilbert passenger list does not flag Bickerton as a convict. A John Bickerton of St. Giles in the Fields (London) was tried and found guilty of highway robbery (stealing a man's periwig in Holborn), and was sentenced to <u>death</u> at the Old Bailey on 12th July 1721. I could find no record of his sentence being reduced. A John Bickerton is mentioned in the Great Choptank Parish Maryland court proceedings 26 Oct 1727. A John Bickerton of Ann Arundell Co., MD was dec'd by 17 Feb 1756 (son: Joseph).
Brindly, Jonathan	Brinley, Jon.a		Noted on Gilbert passenger list as a convict in London. Of St. Brides was tried on 6 th of December 1721 for stealing twelve pint bottles of white wine from the boat of George Matson. <i>Sentenced to transportation in the same session as Edward Corder</i> . A John Briley is listed on Maryland muster rolls from the revolution, but probably not the same person. No listings in the MD State Archives online.
Corder, Edward	Corder, Edwd.		Noted on Gilbert passenger list as a convict in London. No listings in the MD State Archives online.
Cropper, William			No listings in the MD State Archives online.

	Clopper, Mary		Noted on Gilbert passenger list as a convict in London. Of St. Stephen in Coloman Street was found guilty in August of 1721 of feloniously breaking into a private home and stealing a satin gown, petticoat, scarf and hood and pawning them (along with two other women). She was <i>sentenced to transportation in the same session as Edward Corder</i> . No further information in the Clopper Family Forum. (See also Sweetman, Anne)
	Cryer, Wm.		Gilbert passenger list does not flag Cryer as a convict. A William Cryer of St. Andrew, Holborn was a repeat offender beginning in 1717 and 1719 for theft/burglary. A William Cryer of St. Giles without Cripplegate, accused of theft, was sentenced to <u>death</u> for attempted robbery in 1721. A William Cryer of St. Martin in Fields was sentenced to transportation (for stealing “faggots”) in 1723, and then arrested and acquitted twice for returning to England before his term of indenture was up in 1728 and 1729. No relevant information in the Cryer Family Forum. No listings in the MD State Archives online.

Fairborn, John			No listings in the MD State Archives online.
Farthing, Richard	Farthing, Richd.		Noted on Gilbert passenger list as a convict in London. Of St. Martin, Outwich. John Be[a]ton stole lengths of canvas belonging to Wm Knight and Nat Platt and fenced them through Richard Farthing. Both found guilty at trial 6 th of December 1721 and <i>sentenced to transportation in the same session as Edward Corder</i> . No further information in the Farthing Family Forum. No listings in the MD State Archives online. (See also Beaton, John)
Foxwel, Mary			No listings in the MD State Archives online.
Gill, John			A John Gill (son of Roger) was living in MD in 1693 and a John Gill (dec'd) was in MD in 1718 – obviously not the same as the John Gill sentenced in London 1721, but beware of confusing records between these John Gills.
	Graham (alias Grimes), Han.		Gilbert passenger list does not flag Graham as a convict, although she is probably the same Hannah Graham/Grimes of St. Mary, Whitechapel, tried on the 12 th July 1721 for stealing a silver tankard from the home of James Hawkins. She was found guilty and sentenced to <u>death</u> but her sentence was respited due to <u>pregnancy</u> . No listings in the MD State Archives online.
	Goulston, Mary		Gilbert passenger list does not flag Goulston as a convict. A Mary Goulston of St. Anns, Westminster, was tried for stealing a gold watch from Ann Early on 5 th of December 1718 and was sentenced to <u>death</u> , but the sentence was respited for <u>pregnancy</u> . Possibly this is the same Mary Goulston and her sentence may have been lessened to transportation by 1721. No listings in the MD State Archives online.

Graystock, Charles	Graystoke, Chas.		Noted on Gilbert passenger list as a convict in London. No listings in the MD State Archives online.
Hargrove, Elizabeth			No listings in the MD State Archives online.
Hart, John	Hart, John		Noted on Gilbert passenger list as a convict in London. Of St. Sepulchres was tried on 6 th December 1721 for stealing rings, buckles and money from Benjamin Tong, a guest in his home. He was found guilty <i>and sentenced to transportation in the same session as Edward Corder</i> . <u>Married</u> . An Irish John Hart was governor of Maryland 1714-1715, but obviously not the same person.
Harvy, Mary	Harvey (alias Coates), Mary		Noted on Gilbert passenger list as a convict in London. Of St. Botolph, Bishopsgate, was tried on the 5 th of December 1721 for stealing a silver watch from Daniel Cassel during a liaison. She was sentenced to transportation at the <i>same session as Edward Corder</i> . A Mary Harvie/Harvey “late of Kent County, Spinster” did on 1 July 1738 permit an unknown man to have “carnall knowledge of her body” etc. and “gott with child” and was “delivered of a Bastard child” (August Court 1739). May or may not be same woman. There was a Mary Coates in MD in the 1670’s, but obviously not the same person.
Herbert, Sarah	Herbert, Sarah		No details or notation on commuted sentence, but appeared on Gilbert passenger list (without convict notation). Probably the Sarah Herbert of St. Leonard, Shoreditch, tried on 6 th December 1721 and found guilty of stealing a silver tankard from the house of John Robinson. She said that she was drunk and knew not what she did. She mentioned a <u>husband</u> in her testimony, and said that she was pregnant, although upon examination, she was found not to be so. <i>She was sentenced to death in the same session with Edward Corder</i> . A Sarah Herbert was m. by 1735 in MD to Samuel Abbot – don’t know if it is the same woman. No further information in the Herbert Family Forum.
	Hogg, Ja.		Gilbert passenger list does not flag Hogg as a convict. Possibly the James Hogg of St. Giles in the Field, London, tried 11 th October 1721 for knowingly receiving stolen goods. He was found guilty and received a “special verdict”, punishment not specified. No further information in the Hogg Family Forum. MD State Archive listings inconclusive due to multiple instances of name.

Holmes, Robert			No listings in the MD State Archives online.
	Irvenoner, Alexa.		Noted on Gilbert passenger list as a convict in London. No records returned in search of Old Bailey proceedings. No listings in the MD State Archives online.

Langly, William	Langley, Wm.		Noted on Gilbert passenger list as a convict in London. Of Alhallows Barkin was tried on 6 th December 1721 for the theft of twenty-eight pounds of tobacco from one Micajah Perry. <i>Sentenced to transportation in the same session as Edward Corder. A William Langly was paid money for making salt by the "western shore Treasurer" of Maryland in 1782. Probably this same William Langley is found at Patapsco Hunderd in 1783. This MD Wm. Langley may have been related to John Langley who d. St. Mary's Co., 1755 and thus would be a different William Langley. No further information in the Langley Family Forum,</i>
Laws, Samuel*	Saml. Laws		No details or notation on commuted sentence, but appeared on Gilbert passenger list as a convict in London. Of St. Andrew, Holborn, was tried on the 6 th of December 1721 for stealing a quantity of cork from the warehouse of Thomas Allen. He was accused with a William Richards, who, presenting a number of witnesses to his character, was acquitted. Laws was found guilty and <i>sentenced to death in the same session as Edward Corder. No further information in the Laws Family Forum.No listings in the MD State Archives online.</i>
Lee, John			MD State Archive listings inconclusive due to multiple instances of name.
Mason, Edward			MD State Archive listings inconclusive due to multiple instances of name.
	Merrit (alias Watson), Ann		Gilbert passenger list does not flag Merrit as a convict. Probably the "Ann Merrit – alias Walden" of St. Mary, Whitechapel, who is mentioned several times in the Old Bailey sessions during 1721, usually in connection with a theft, however, this Ann Merrit alias Walden was sentenced to <u>death</u> at the 12 th July 1721 session (same session as John Bickerton) but was respited due to <u>pregnancy</u> . <i>No further information in the Merrit, Merritt, Walden Family Forums, No listings for Ann Merrit, Merritt in MD state archives; listings for Ann Watson inconclusive.</i>
Mob, Elizabeth*	Eliz.e Mobbs		Noted on Gilbert passenger list as a convict in London. Probably Elizabeth Mob of St. Ethelburg within Bishopsgate tried 6 th Dec 1721 and found guilty of pick pocketing. Sentenced to <u>death</u> but was respited and transported due to <u>pregnancy</u> . (Interestingly, Mob said that the money found on her was not stolen, but was tendered for services rendered to the plaintiff in private.) <i>No further information in the Mobbs Family Forum.No listings in the MD State Archives online.</i>
	Moore, Rebecca		Noted on Gilbert passenger list as a convict in London. London: Of St. Botolph without Bishopgate was tried 12 th August 1721 for stealing miscellaneous goods belonging to Henry Walden and was found guilty and <i>sentenced to transportation on 30th August 1721. No further information in the Moore Family Forum. MD State Archives online inconclusive.</i>
Nash, John			MD State Archives online inconclusive; a John Nash lived in MD in the 1670s. Another John Nash is mentioned in the MD tax records of 1783.
Nichols, Ann			MD State Archives online inconclusive; in 1762 an Ann Nichols is mentioned in a Somerset Co., MD record along with Mary Nichols, but probably not the same person.

Overy, John			MD State Archives online list a John Overy as a landowner at Elkridge Hundred 1783. Possibly same person.
Pain, Ann			MD State Archives online inconclusive; an Ann Pain is named in the 1748 will of Roger Wright of Dorchester Co. Probably not same person.
	Parker, Elizabeth (Eliz.e)		Noted on Gilbert passenger list as a convict in London. Probably Elizabeth Parker of St. Botolph without Aldersgate, tried 11 th Oct 1721 for simple grand larceny, having stolen a substantial weight of cotton from one John Tranter, she was sentenced to transportation. No further information in the Parker Family Forum.MD State Archive listings inconclusive due to multiple instances of name.
Parker, Tho.			MD State Archive listings inconclusive due to multiple instances of name.
Pool, John			The Kent County MD court of June 1724 mentions a John Pool and his wife Mary. Not sure if these could be the same as the John Pool sentenced to transportation in 1721. A John Pool was on the tax assessment of Baltimore County MD in 1783.
Salner, Christian			No listings in the MD State Archives online.
Scoon, John			No listings in the MD State Archives online.
Seaton, John			No listings in the MD State Archives online.
Sergeant, John			Although there are references to a John Sergeant in early MD records, they are inconclusive.
	Simpson, Thomas		Noted on Gilbert passenger list as a convict in London. Of St. Peter in Cornhill was tried 30 ⁿ August 1721 for stealing beef from George Brooks. He was <i>sentenced to transportation</i> on the same date. MD State Archive listings inconclusive due to multiple instances of name.
Slater, Rebeccah			No listings in the MD State Archives online.
	Swann (alias Graves), Jno.		Noted on Gilbert passenger list as a convict in London. No records returned in search of Old Bailey proceedings. No further information in the Swan or Graves Family Forum. There were several Swanns on the 1783 Charles County assessment list, including a Jonathan, but this may be a different family since our Jonathan used Graves as an alias. No listings in MD Archives for a Jonathan Graves.

	Sweetman, Anne		Noted on Gilbert passenger list as a convict in London. See Mary Clopper for summary of trial <i>sentenced to transportation in the same session as Edward Corder</i> . No further information in the Sweetman Family Forum.No listings in the MD State Archives online.
Thomas, Edward			MD State Archive listings inconclusive due to multiple instances of name.
Veal, Daniel			No listings in the MD State Archives online.
	Walton, Rog.		Gilbert passenger list does not flag Walton as a convict. No records returned in search of Old Bailey proceedings. A Robert Walton of London was tried on the 6 th of Decemner 1721 for stealing, in Rochester, a black mare in belonging to Richard Tinke and of hiding the mare at an inn in Shoreditch. He was found guilty and sentenced to <i>death in the same session as Edward Corder</i> . No further information in the Walton Family Forum. A Roger Walton appears in the Provincial Court records of Maryland 1637-1650 – obviously not the man we're looking for.
	Warminger, Jno.		Noted on Gilbert passenger list as a convict in London. Of St. Sepulchres was tried 11 th October 1721 for stealing bowls from Joseph de Costa. He plead poverty and then said he found the bowls, and received a reduced <i>sentence of transportation</i> that same day. No further information (no Warminger Family Forum), No listings in the MD State Archives online.
Williams, Ann			MD State Archive listings inconclusive due to multiple instances of name.
Wingfield, William	Wingfoild, Wm.		Noted on Gilbert passenger list as a convict in London. Of St. Peters, Cheap[side?] was tried on 6 th of December 1721 for stealing numerous articles of textiles and about 20 guineas from the house of Richard Skinner (he testified that his supposedly pregnant girlfriend, Mary Harman, with whom he was tried, had put him up to it). Wingfield was the servant of Richard Skinner. He was found guilty and <i>sentenced to transportation in the same session as Edward Corder</i> . Listed as William Winfield, arrived in Annapolis, 1722, probably the same. No further information in the Wingfield Family Forum.No listings in the MD State Archives online.
